



In May 1945, following Hitler's suicide at the end of April, the Nazis surrendered; the war in Europe was over!


However, the Pacific war was not over against the Japanese.

No one knew what the effects of this new super weapon would be, but Truman was considering using it to end the war in the Pacific.






The Japanese will never surrender. Japan have 5000 aircraft and 5 million soldiers prepared to fight to their death.




We don't know the true effects of the bomb.

Many innocent people will die.






Truman dropped the bomb, changing the world FOREVER!








First there was a glaring pinkish light in the sky, which burned out people's eyes.

Within seconds, 75,000 people were incinerated






This human shadow is all that was left of a person standing with a ladder in the centre of the explosion.

Three days later, the Americans dropped a second atomic bomb on Nagasaki killing 36,000 people.







Why did the US decide to drop the bomb?

- Pacific war
- Millions invested in development
- Growing threat from USSR
- Vengeance for torture & suicide attacks



What happened when the bomb was dropped?






- 6 August 1945 Enola Gay dropped atomic bomb on Hiroshima
- 75,000 immediate deaths
- 200,000+ deaths radiationand fall out
- 9 August, Nagasaki 40,000 deaths
- 14 August Japan surrenders

What did the bombs look like?


'Little Boy' Uranium,



'Fat Man', Plutonium, Nagasaki

How powerful were they?

- Little Boy' blast equivalent to 20,000 tons of explosives detonated at once
- Strong winds from blast destroyed all buildings within a
 1.5 mile radius
- Heat generated incinerated everything in its path
