
How did Britain become a Welfare State after WW2?



Is this the most important man of 20th Century Britain?



Sir William Beveridge

Published a report on 'want' in Britain in 1942, he proposed a free National Health Service and 'cradle to grave' help for ALL citizens of Britain.

Beveridge identified 5 giants or problems in Britain that needed destroying to rebuild Britain

TACKLING THE FIRST GIANT



"WANT is only one of the five giants on the road of reconstruction." — The Beveridge Report.



As we know from previous topics in this study of Britain in the 20th Century, what is the problem in 1945 and why would Beveridge's idea seem hopeless?


Despite Winston Churchill leading Britain to victory in WW2, he and the rest of the country were in shock when he was beaten in the General Election of 1945 by Labour and new Prime Minister Clement Attlee. Some say Attlee is the greatest leader of modern Britain...

Although Britain had been severely damaged in WW2, and was economically in trouble, Attlee set about transforming Britain in to a country fit and fair for all. This would rely on loans from the USA that were only paid off in 2005.

It would begin by dealing with Beveridge's '5 Giants'...







The Creator of the NHS, the most important creation in the world? Ever?



1. Squalor

Caused by poor housing. The solution was to build ¼ million homes, re-house millions and make new towns in the countryside

2. Disease


People were contracting diseases and couldn't afford medical treatment. It would be solved by encouraging free health care and free injections. Free dentists and opticians.





3. Ignorance

People needed knowledge to help them in life. This meant compulsory, free schooling for children up to 15. New schools and teachers were found.





4. Idleness

People needed jobs after the war and Britain needed workers. This proposed opening new factories and stressed the importance of working after the economic Depression. Rebuilding the new towns would help too.







5. Want

People were struggling to pay for things. This suggested free health care and schooling. Benefits such as Family Allowance were introduced by Beveridge.


