


Failing the peaceful protesting of the NUWSS (Suffragists), the WSPU (Suffragettes) changed tactics. Create a table in your book with the title

Why did the Suffragettes WANT to get arrested?




Suffragettes often went on hunger strike in prison.

What could the government NOT allow to happen?






They decided to force feed the women.
